- Take a moment to pause, to reflect and to pray.



Judas greets Jesus with a kiss, identifying him for the Romans who have come to arrest him.

Judas' kiss became the most poignant symbol of betrayal in the Christian world.

Going at once to Jesus, Judas said, "Rabbi!" and kissed him - Mark 14: 45
