  - Support with starting school, learning routines, and making friends.
- Physical and emotional wellbeing support for families
  - Making sure families have shelter, food and stability and ensuring that they have a support network in place for their emotional needs.
- For those with cancer who need comfort and peace.
- For those who have experienced loss, recently or in the past.
- For Croydon council's financial situation for wisdom in decision making.
- Weariness with materialism and violence.
- A hunger for God.
- A spirit of forgiveness.
- Poverty in Croydon.
- That the council, schools, third party sectors, churches etc, all make good decisions on monetary awards.
  - That additional support is given this may be budgeting, companionship, employment and employment preparation, understanding, not judging, nurturing etc.
- That residents use the resources available to them!
- Our emergency services: Fire, Ambulance, Police.
