Gather Listen Intercede

"My sheep listen to my voice, I know them, and they follow me." 1 John 10:27

This is a snapshot of some of the prayer activities we are using during our 24 hours. We hope that you will be able to use some at home.

Looking back with thanks

O LORD my God, you have performed many wonders for us.

Your plans for us are too numerous to list.

You have no equal. If I tried to recite all your wonderful deeds, I would never come to the end of them. Ps 40:5

We have prayed in many ways for many different things. Think back over the year. Spend some time thanking God for prayers He has answered for you, for our community and the wider world.

Response: Write prayers of thanks to share

Adoration. Hallowed be your name

Come, let us tell of the Lord's greatness; let us exalt his name together. Psalm 34:3

Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead.1 Peter 1:3

Adoration prayers focus on praising the Lord, expressing our love, devotion, and wonder for who He is.

Confession

Come now, let us settle the matter," says the Lord. Though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though they are red as crimson, they shall be like wool. Isaiah 1: 18

As far as the east is from the west, So far has He removed our transgressions from us. Psalm 103: 12

If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness. 1 John 1: 9

Response: Choose one of the verses and reflect on it

- Does it bring to mind anything that you would like to confess to God?
- If so, write it on a white card in red pen
- Confess it to God
- Wash it off
- Hold the clean card, read the verses
- Thank God for His promise that he forgives us and removes our sin. Celebrate the freedom!

Listen to God

"My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me." John 10:27

Prayer is a two-way conversation with the Lord. He loves to hear us and to speak to us.

Sometimes, it can feel easier to spend our prayer time talking to the Lord, rather than listening to what He might be saying to us.

Response

The Lord speaks to us in many ways: through the bible, nature, music, words, feelings, pictures. We want to learn to listen to what He might want to say.

Listen – What is the Lord saying?

- Pick up one of the verses or use your own choice of verse.
- · Read it a few times.
- Pray Come Holy Spirit, speak to me through these words.
- Sit with the verse for at least 10 mins.
- Consider:
 - Lord, what are you saying to Emmanuel?
 - Lord what are you saying to me?
- As thoughts come to your mind ponder them, you may choose to write them down.
- Pray Use these to form a prayer to share.
- Write it on a card and stick on the pinboard.

Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. Philippians 4: 6

How great is the love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are! 1 John 3: 1

Persistence in prayer

Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. Matthew 7:7

For this activity use a few Lego type bricks or something that will stack.

Choose something from Emmanuel or in your own life that you have been asking God to change for a long time. Pray for it over and over as you build a tower of bricks.

At the cross

If you have a cross you could use this. Sit or kneel before the cross in humility

Take time to confess things you've done wrong or good things you've left undone, admitting that you need God's help.

Dare to pray big prayers at the foot of the cross that you haven't prayed before, or you stopped praying because you didn't think they'd be answered.

Pray for God to be known in your life and the life of your nation in a completely new way: for his glory to be known in your community and shine out across the

Pray for Emmanuel

This is real love—not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as a sacrifice to take away our sins. Dear friends, since God loved us that much, we surely ought to love each other. No one has ever seen God. But if we love each other, God lives in us, and his love is brought to full expression in us. 1 John 4:10–12 (NLT)

Praying persistently

Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. Matthew 7:7

For this it would be useful to have some Lego type bricks or something that will stack.

- Take something that you have been praying for a while -in your own life, your family, friend, the wider world
- Collect 6 or 7 blocks. Make a tower.

Each time you add a new block pray again for the situation.

When you are done, read this verse:

May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit. Romans 15:13

- Knock over the tower, a sign of God heard your prayer.
- Repeat as many times as you want to
- If helpful find someone to pray with you

Persistence in prayer

We believe and trust that the Lord always hears and answers our prayer.

Sometimes we receive an instant answer, the way we had hoped.

Sometimes we have to wait a while for the answer.

Sometimes the answer is "no" and we seemingly don't get what we pray for. We are asked to not give up despite challenges or a lack of immediate answers to our prayers. Instead, we keep trusting in God's will, love, and timing, and we

persist in prayer.

If helpful, find someone to pray with you for the situation.

Dedication

Therefore, I urge you, brothers, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God—this is your spiritual act of worship. Rom 12:1
