
STARTER:

Most of us have a daily routine. Do you feel as if your routine reflects what you love to do? Is reading the Bible part of your daily routine? If so, how does it fit in?

Read Psalm 119 : 105

Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path.

This well-known and well-loved verse is our **Verse of the Year 2022** at Emmanuel Croydon. If you haven't already got one, be sure to get a postcard from church that reflects the beauty of the verse and will be something you can use as a reminder through the coming months.


REVELATION AND GUIDANCE – A LAMP TO OUR PATH

BIBLE STUDY



The first part of the passage talks about the Bible being **a lamp for our feet**.

- The Hebrew word for lamp used here is **'niyar'**. This word is similar to the subtle light of a candle - a light that is not dazzlingly bright, but enough to navigate one step at a time. Reflect on what this might mean for us as believers as we seek God's guidance in our lives.
- The niyar lamp that is used in this passage was a small oil lamp. ***What would you say provides the oil for the 'lamp for our feet'?*** (Psalm 18 : 28)
- As we think about this image of the Bible as a lamp for our feet, what might be some of the potholes that it illuminates on the road we walk on in our daily lives?

The second part of the verse talks about the Bible being **a light for our path.**

- How might the image of a path be seen as different from the image of daily steps used in the first part of the verse?
- How might this description of the Bible help us to see our lives as believers?
- **Psalm 119 : 105** translated in the Passion Translation reads: *Truth's shining light guides me in my choices and decisions; the revelation of your Word makes my pathway clear.*
- How does it encourage us to remember that the Bible brings truth in the world we now live in?
- In what ways might we seek 'the revelation of God's word' so that our pathway is clear? What ways have you found that are particularly helpful to you as a Christian as you seek guidance?





Read Psalm 119 : 130


The unfolding of your words gives light;

- What might this mean for our daily routine?

- How do you think we might seek to renew our mind?
- What does this verse teach us about guidance?

BIBLE STUDY



STARTER:

Remembering Bible passages that bring us comfort or joy is an important part of our walk as believers. What are your favourite ways to bring to mind such passages for when you want reassurance from the Lord?

Our first **Psalm 119 study** looked at a strong trust in God's word for guidance.

Today, the Psalmist is seeking assurance from the Bible, as his mood changes.




Read Psalm 119 : 81-82

My soul faints with longing for your salvation, but I have put my hope in your word. My eyes fail, looking for your promise; I say, “When will you comfort me?”

- How would you describe the Psalmist’s mood in this section of **Psalm 119** (look at verses 81-88)?
- In **verse 81**, the Psalmist says ‘my soul faints with longing for your salvation’.

The word used here for salvation does not mean ‘justification by faith through grace’ as we may understand our salvation now. It means ‘victory or deliverance from an enemy’. Asking God for victory over an enemy – how might this be a description of our walk as believers? What enemies are you aware of in your life at the moment?


ASSURANCE – PROMISES TO HOLD ON TO

BIBLE STUDY



Psalm 119 : 81-82

- Discouragement has turned many away from faith. Why do you think discouragement might first take root in the life of a believer?
- The second part of **verse 81** has the important words ‘but I have put my hope in your word’. What building blocks do you think we need to put into place in order to reach this ‘but’ when we’re going through a situation of difficulty and struggle as a believer?
- What do you think might happen to our view of God if we don’t reach the point of hope in God’s word?
- **Read verse 82 and also 84.** Why do you think waiting is often part of the faith journey?

ASSURANCE – PROMISES TO HOLD ON TO

GOING DEEPER

What can help us to learn to trust God when we feel out of control?

Spend some time looking at these verses and discussing how we can use them as foundations for our current situation:

1. **God's ways are higher than our ways.**
Look up Colossians 1 : 16-17; Isaiah 46 : 9-10.
2. **God is wiser than us - he knows what he's doing.**
Look at Romans 11 : 33 and Proverbs 3 : 5-6.
3. **God's love is perfect and unchanging.**
Look at Lamentations 3 vv 22-26.
(The word for salvation in verse 26 is the same as in Psalm 119 : 81).
Romans 8 : 31-32.

STARTER:

If someone asked you what brings you delight, what would you answer?

Read Psalm 119 : 103

How sweet are your words to my taste, sweeter than honey to my mouth.

- What do you think has inspired the Psalmist to use such strong language? **Read verses 97 – 104 for more thoughts.**
- Have you ever thought about the words of the Bible as being ‘sweeter than honey’?

What might hold us back from using such a strong description? Where do you think we might seek our ‘sugar fix’ instead?

- What might be needed for us to experience the same sweetness about the words of Scripture? How do you think our lives change when we begin to find God’s words sweet?

BIBLE STUDY



Read Psalm 34 : 8

Taste and see that the Lord is good; blessed is the one who takes refuge in him

- As we reach out into a relationship with the Lord by tasting and seeing, what is the promise that follows? How has this been your experience?
- What would you say to someone who interpreted 'taste' as meaning that Christianity can be mixed up as a smorgasbord with other religions and beliefs?
- Thinking about these two verses, how might we see the Bible differently if we consider it as something that delights and sustains us?

GOING DEEPER

Read 1 Peter 2 : 2-3

- What are the results of tasting in these verses?
- What happens to a baby who is not fed good milk?
- What do you think pure spiritual milk might involve?
- How might we sense that we are growing up in our salvation?






Read Psalm 119 : 9-11

How can a young person stay on the path of purity?

By living according to your word. I seek you with all my heart; do not let me stray from your commands. I have hidden your word in my heart that I might not sin against you.

- Of course, these verses are not just for young people (v.9), but for all those seeking wisdom. What do you think it might mean for believers to seek to 'stay on the path of purity' in 21st century Croydon? What challenges are we up against?
- **The second part of verse 9** says that we need to live according to God's word in order to be pure. What needs to happen for us to do this - to our attitude, and our daily habits?

- The Bible teaches us to be 'wholehearted' in our pursuit of God, and this is reinforced in **verse 10**. In what ways do you think we may fall short of being wholehearted in our walk as believers? Can you think of biblical examples of wholehearted living?

Psalm 119 : 9-11

How can a young person stay on the path of purity?

By living according to your word. I seek you with all my heart; do not let me stray from your commands. I have hidden your word in my heart that I might not sin against you.

- Look at **Psalm 119 verse 2**. How does it work together with **verse 10**? What do you think it means to be blessed, when keeping God's commands might result in rejection or even persecution?
- Look at **verse 11**. How did Jesus model what this verse says in his encounter with Satan in the wilderness?
(See Matthew 4 : 1-11 for a reminder).

- As we begin this New Year at Emmanuel with a focus on the Bible, how do you think you might as a small group find new ways to 'hide the word in your heart'?

Why is it important that we learn to do this, according to the Psalmist (**v11**)?
